Course Description:

This ensemble course will serve as an introduction to the performance technique, theory, history, and cultural context of the gamelan traditions of Central and West Java. As the primary focus is on playing, we will concentrate our efforts on learning and rehearsing pieces drawn from the standard repertoire in the cultural/geographic areas of Java, Sunda, and Cirebon. We may also have discussion, listening, and video viewing sessions to help provide context to the music. There will be at least one additional required practice/rehearsal session per week in addition to the scheduled course time. The day/time for this will be decided in class in the first weeks.

As this is an ensemble, and inter-dependence among the players is of paramount importance, regular and continued attendance and participation in rehearsals and performances is absolutely essential. Ensemble members will be expected to arrive early enough to begin rehearsal promptly at 5:30 p.m. Late arrivals and excused absences must be kept to an absolute minimum, and no unexcused absences will be tolerated. If attendance and/or participation become problematic, members may be asked to leave the ensemble, and final grades will reflect this.
