You must include footnotes/endnotes/citations where appropriate and full bibliography of all sources consulted, including URLs for websites on the WWW. You must consult a minimum of 5 sources beyond (i.e. in addition to) the course texts. You must submit an electronic 'soft' copy of the paper in MSWord format along with the printed 'hard' copy. You may do this via email attachment or CD-R. These minimum guidelines must be met for any credit to

be awarded.
